Australian Snakes

Room 8, 9 and 10 are learning about Australian Snakes. We have had preserved snakes in our classroom and have been observing their features!

Jack: Snakes have internal ears, not external ears. Snakes are vertebrates they have a backbone.

Ruby: When snakes shed their skin, their eyes go opaque (cloudy)

Liza - Snakes don't have eyelids. Snakes can be poisonous or non-poisonous.

Kyama-Lee Snakes don't have eyelids.

Zade- All snakes are cold blooded and warm themselves in the sun.

Payal - Snakes are limbless and smell using their tongue.

Sarina - Snakes have flexible jaws so they can eat large prey.

Brock- Snakes are reptiles because they have scales!

Van Dawt Chin - There are around 3000 species of snakes. They live everywhere around the world except Antarctica, Iceland, Greenland and New Zealand.
