CHILD PROTECTION

Dear Parent / Caregiver,

I am writing to inform you about the Keeping Safe: Child Protection Curriculum (KS:CPC) that your child / children will be learning throughout the year. The teachers delivering the program have received explicit training in the use of the Curriculum. The Keeping Safe Curriculum is a Department for Education responsibility under the *South Australia Children and Young People (Safety) Act 8673* and the *Child Protection in Schools, Early Childhood Education and Care Services policy* to ensure that effective abuse preventions programs are implemented and that all children and young people have access to the approved child protection curriculum.

Although parent permission is required under the *Education and Children's Services Regulations 2020*, we encourage parents / carers to seek further clarification if required and to provide the teacher with any relevant information about their child that could alleviate any concerns.

Keeping Safe is an evidence based, best practice curriculum developed collaboratively with child protection experts, teachers, educational leaders and other professionals.

SCHOOL CARD INFORMATION

APPLYING FOR A SCHOOL CARD

All types of School Card applications **are now online**.

You can access the online forms from any device that gets internet, including mobile devices, such as tablets and smart phones, as well as laptops and computers.

Applying online is easy! Simply follow the steps below.

- STEP 1** Visit sa.gov.au/education/schoolcard
- STEP 2** Select the type of School Card you would like to apply for (for example 'Type A') and follow the prompts.
- STEP 3** Complete all mandatory fields.
Please note: you cannot submit your application unless all mandatory fields are complete.
- STEP 4** Once you have completed a page click on the 'NEXT' button
- STEP 5** Once you have filled out all pages click the 'SUBMIT' button
Please note: if you exit the form without clicking 'SUBMIT' your details will be lost.

You can save the form and return to complete it at another time, by clicking on the 'SAVE' button.
